BUDGET OVERVIEW

The Voorheesville Public Library is dedicated to providing you access to information, services, and materials that enrich your life. We are here to serve you.

In 2018, Gail Sacco, our Director for 30 years, retired, making way for new leadership. In November, Sarah Clark joined the VPL team as Director. Coming from managing two branches of the Albany Public Library, she is thrilled to be working in Voorheesville where she has been a long-time resident. Her goal for the library, in addition to building upon its successes, is to elevate visibility within the community through strong outreach, expanded free programming, improvements to the physical library space, and most importantly, support of all types of literacy for all ages.





While we support literacy of all types, the library has a special focus on early literacy. Our goal is to help children develop a desire and ability to read and to comprehend many forms of communication. As expert storytime providers, librarians inspire children. They also support and validate the efforts of parents/caregivers with early literacy strategies and tips, explaining the "why" behind what they are doing. We strive to build confidence in the adults who are their children's first and most important teachers by modeling early literacy best practices. VPL encourages lifelong learning by meeting a child's needs through all stages of development and teaching them that the library is a safe, supportive space and an invaluable resource.

As stewards of the funds you provide to the library, we strive to continuously increase benefits while limiting cost. The library board of trustees and leadership are proposing a budget that continues on the path of increasing the value provided to the community while decreasing expenses or keeping expenses constant. We are committed to maintaining and upgrading the existing facility within this budget. We are exploring ways to further improve the building, with an emphasis on safety, sustainability, and access.





One of the ways we are increasing value is by sharing resources as we work with community partners to provide benefits inside and outside the walls of the library. The staff is working collaboratively with many organizations including the schools, churches, fire departments, Town and Village, businesses, Friends of the Voorheesville Public Library and other groups. Expect to see much more of us as we go forward!

## **Expanded Tween & Teen Services**

VPL Teens Care provides engaging service activities for students such as baking bread for a community lunch and making toys for shelter animals. VPL collaborated with our school libraries to increase the variety of titles available for classroom assignments. A new after-hours book club was formed when requested by high school students. All of these experiences build the students comfort with the public library and its staff, leading to an increase in students' usage of our resources.

**Tax Cap** This amount is \$11,399 more than last year's budget. It is estimated to be under the tax cap by \$43,622.

**State Aid** The library was awarded funding through the NYS Construction Aid program. This award funds up to 50% of eligible Capital Projects.\* Expect new ADA-compliant bathrooms, a safely lit parking lot (paving completed in 2018-19 budget year), and an updated sign.
